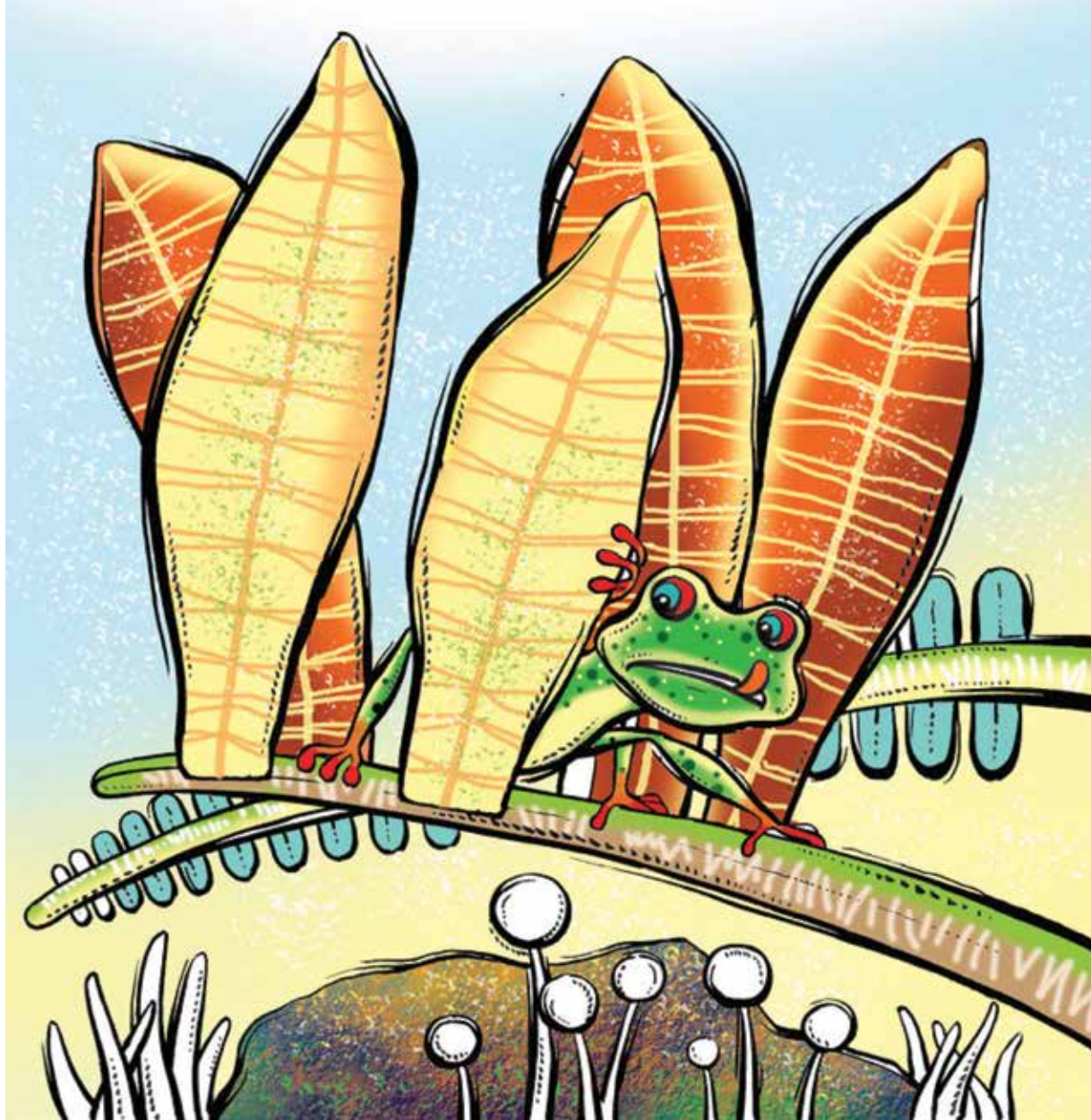

He had to come up with a plan.



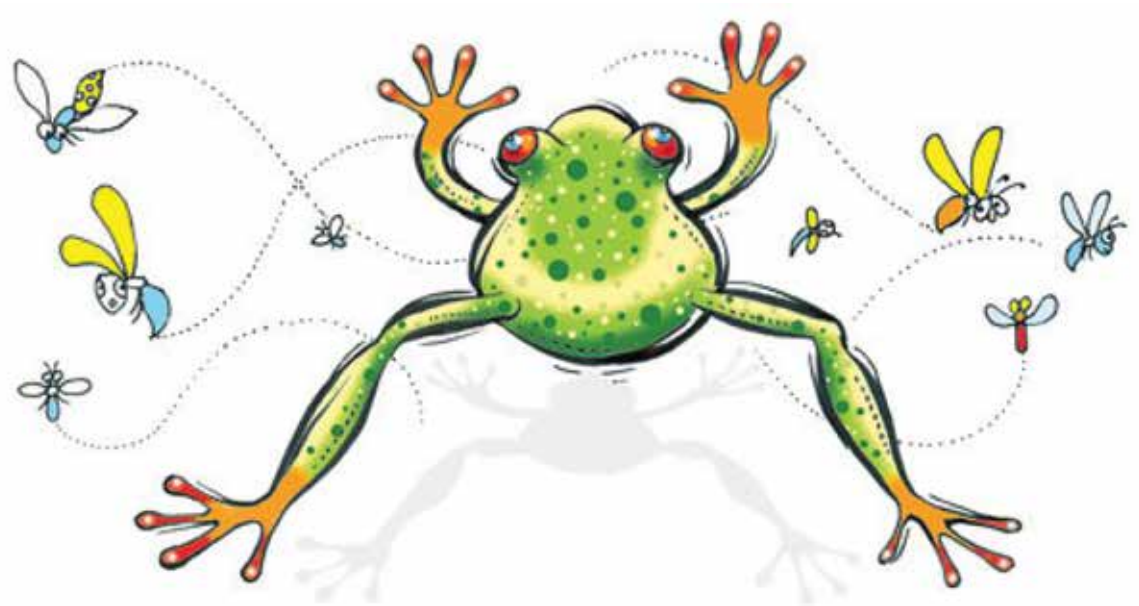
“I wish I had food today,” he said.

He looked all around.

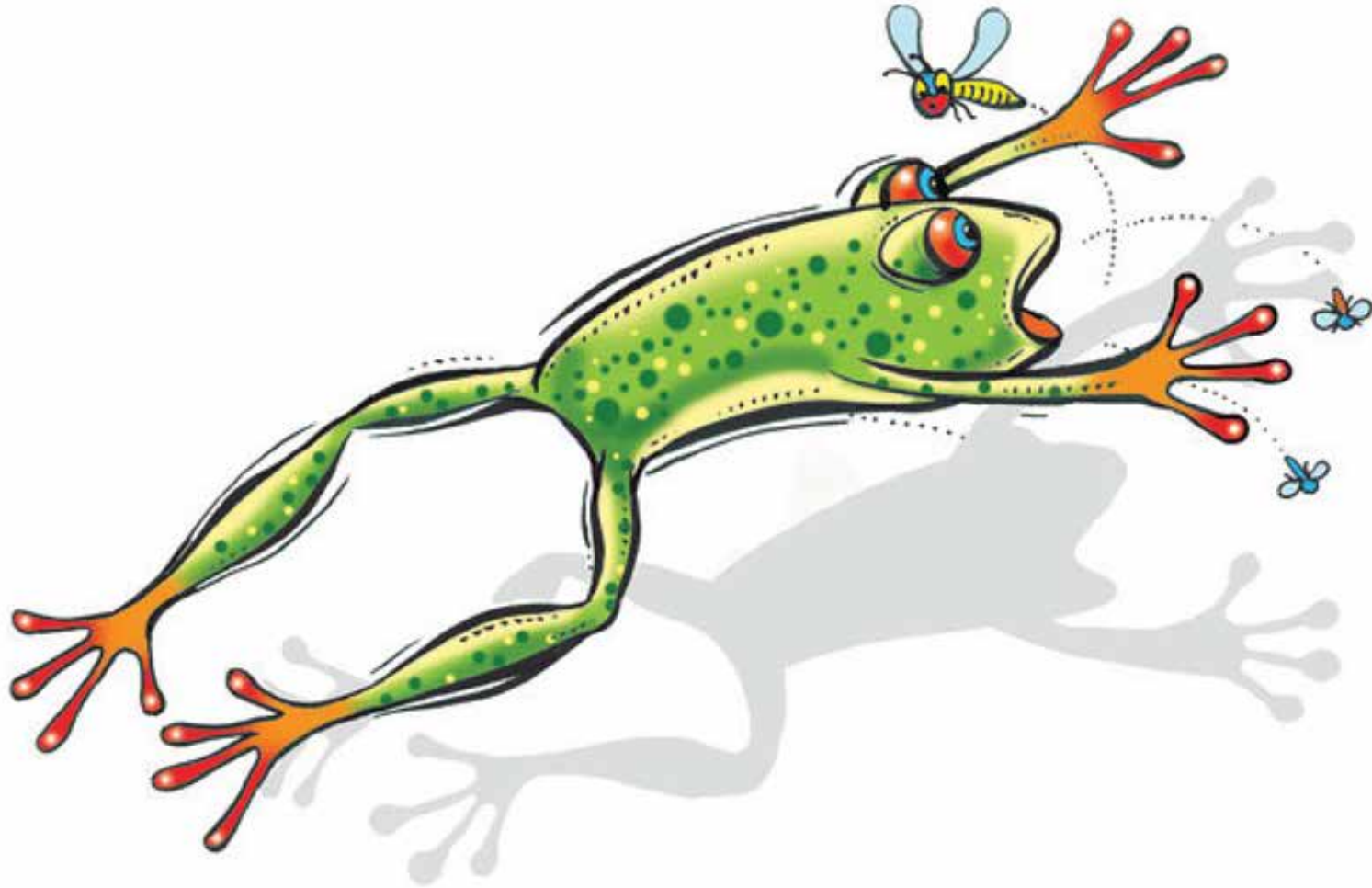


He saw a lot of bugs flying around.

“I will eat until I am full.”



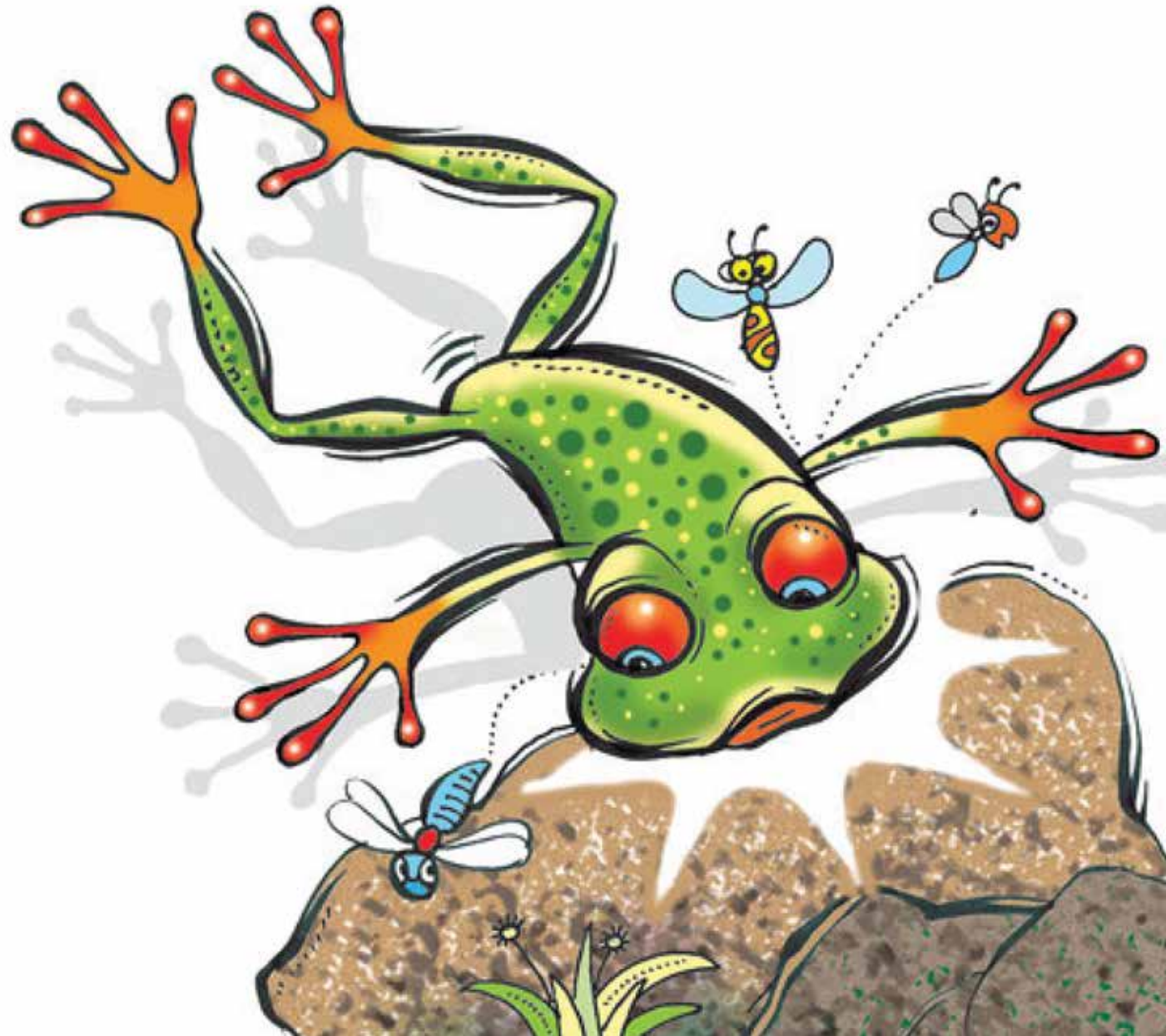
“I need to catch those bugs,” said Frog.

Frog jumped there.

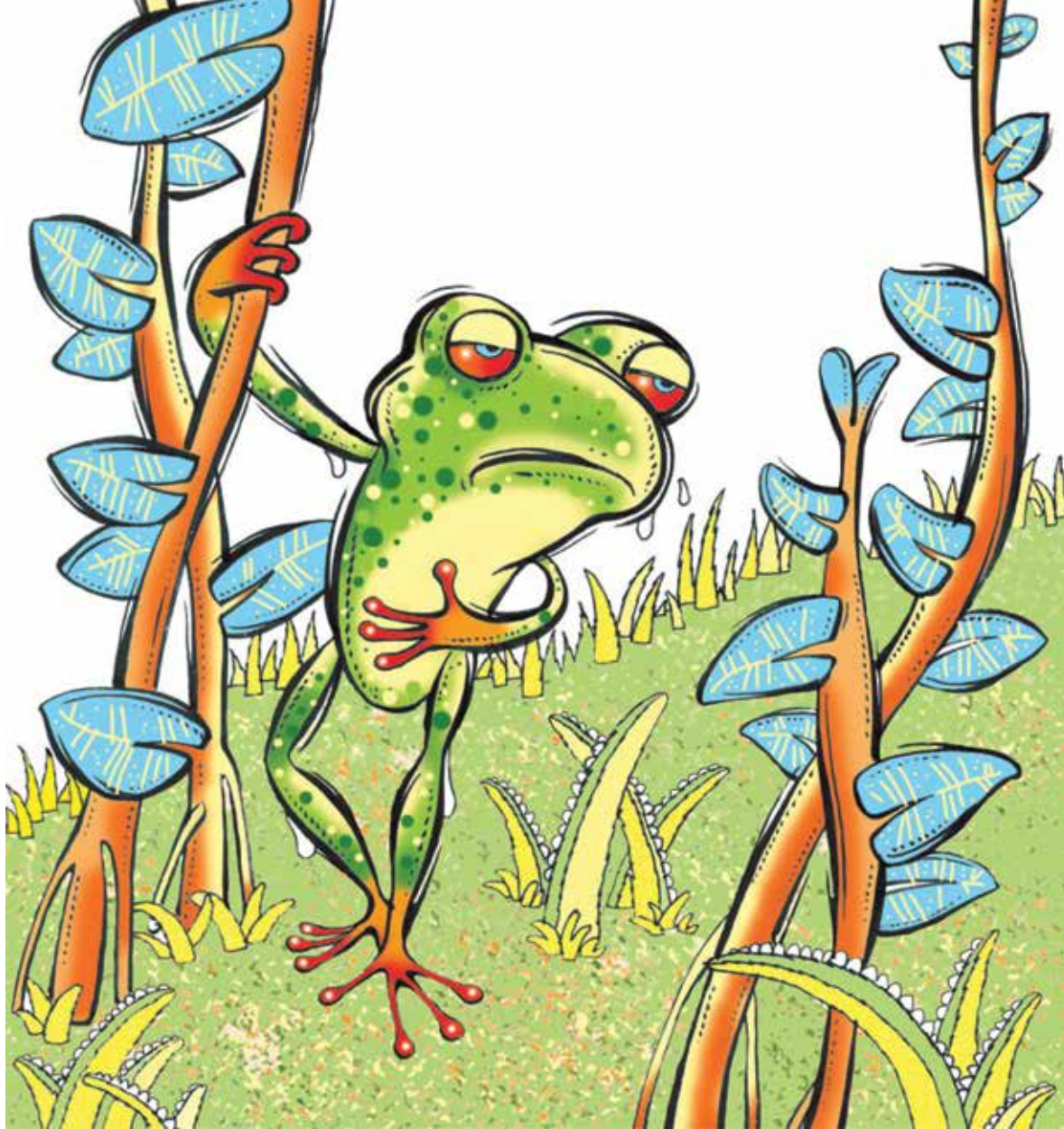




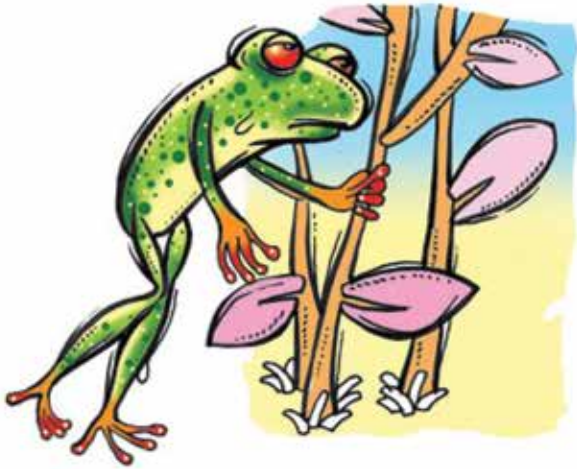
Frog jumped up.

“The bugs are fast!” he said.



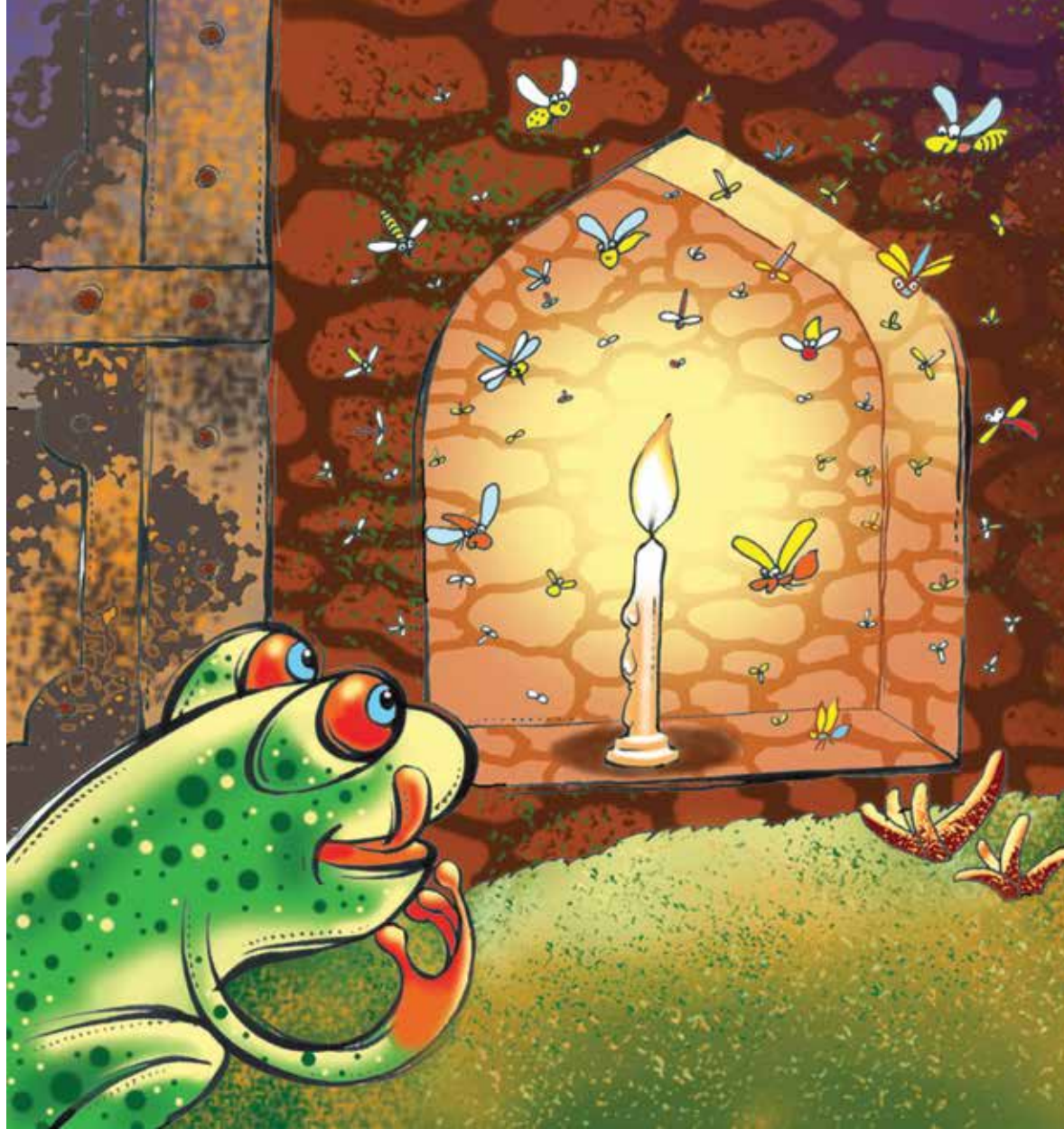
“How will I catch them?”

“This is how I will catch my dinner today!” said Frog.



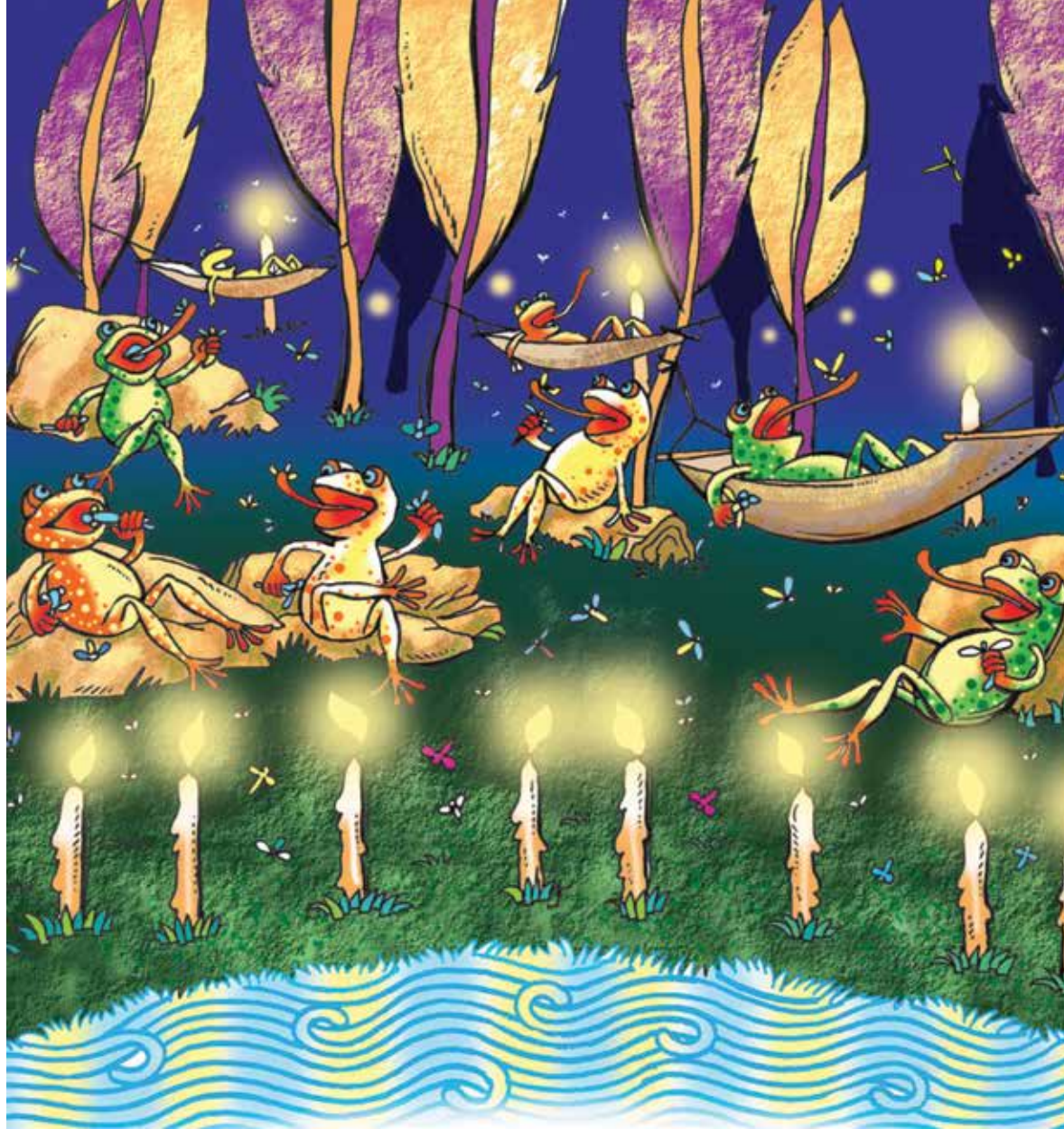
He lit the candle.
