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PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

*Essential Performance Responsibilities

- * 1. To assist the Director of Secondary Education in planning, developing, implementing, coordinating, supervising, and evaluating of selected programs.
- * 2. To develop, coordinate, monitor and evaluate the AVID Program, Advanced Placement Program and Virtual course offerings.
- * 3. To coordinate, recruit and select students for the AVID Program, Advanced Placement Program and or Virtual course offerings.
- * 4. To assist schools with scheduling Advanced Placement, AVID Program, Virtual program, registration of students, arrangement of correspondence courses, summer school, summer opportunities, and college planning.
- * 5. To assist principals in selecting and evaluating AVID and Advanced Placement teachers.
- * 6. To coordinate meetings, professional development opportunities, and other related AVID or Advanced Placement events and activities.
- * 7. To complete annual AVID teacher certifications.
- * 8. To collect data for the national AVID center.
- * 9. To meet with and work with AVID and Advanced Placement students and families on a regular basis to discuss concerns and monitor student progress.
- * 10. To supervise AVID and Advanced Placement tutor recruitment, training and payroll.
- * 11. To manage AVID and Advanced Placement program budgets
- * 12. To collect and disseminate information and data from AVID, Virtual program, and Advanced Placement programs
- * 13. To assist in the selection, implementation, distribution, monitoring, and evaluation of instructional materials relative to selected curriculum subject area.
- * 14. Serve as program consultant to school personnel with assistance in the identification of all program needs and the selection of appropriate materials and equipment.
- * 15. Maintain a close working relationship with district and school administrators to ensure information exchange, coordination of efforts, and general support.
- * 16. Prepare all required reports and maintain all appropriate records.
- * 17. Monitor assessment data and take steps to promote student achievement in areas needing improvement.
- * 18. To perform such duties as may be assigned by the Supervisor or Director.
