PPG Reconnect 15-21 x semester 30 Prevention Partnership Grant (PPG) RECONNECT is a culturally appropriate substance abuse prevention program targeted to youth grades 6 to 12 who may be at risk or currently under the influence of substances. PPG Reconnect program uses both a Middle School (grades 6 to 9) and High School (9 to 12) LifeSkills Training (LST), an evidence based substance abuse prevention curriculum. PPG Reconnect is dedicated to strengthening supportive relationships both within the home and in the community by guiding at-risk youth and their families to effective substance misuse recovery-oriented programming.

Parent Science Night 1 50 We will hold family science night to reinforce concepts that the students learned in the classroom. Science Night is great planned activity to get parents, siblings, and grandparents engaged in their student's learning in the classroom. Not only will a science or STEM night give families a chance to see what their kids are learning, but it can also help them take an active role in supporting their learning at home. Students will enjoy involving their families by showing off their work and performing some activities or mini-labs while sharing interesting concepts.

Barriers

The Sumter PREP Academy's main barriers are the following:

- a) Only one alternative education school for the entire county including South and North End. The parents in the South End have about 30 to 45 minutes drive to our school in comparison to the North End.
- b) Our school parent's population is economically disadvantaged including Exceptional Student Education (ESE).
- c) English Language Learners (ELL) have limitations in literacy in terms of reading comprehension and cultural insensitivity.
- d) Parent obligations with other younger siblings.
- e) Our students are being raised by grandparents who are not versed in technology.
- f) Limited Wi-Fi Signal.
- g) Lack of nutrition and personal hygiene.

To overcome these barriers the following measures will be instated:

- a) For parents who are unable to attend, the resources will be sent electronically via the Remind app. Also, whenever possible parents will have the option to join sessions via TEAMS, or by phone call.
- b) Having in mind our parents and guardians, our communications will be written in plain, simple English, for Spanish Speakers and Readers home communications will be sent in Spanish, and a translator will be on site.
- c) We will consider other school's and community calendars when we schedule parent's activities.
- d) The activities below will be planned to address constantly the new barriers and to discuss specific strategies.
- e) Send paper copy versions of the electronic materials home.
- f) We provide students Wi-Fi with a portable My-Fi device.
- g) We provide hygiene bags for parents, students, and siblings to remove that barrier. Our PBIS Breakfast is not catered and is instead home-cooked.
